





Giving out something that is deserved, reward or punishment.</p>
		<p>Reconciliation</p> 	<p>To restore or bring back friendly relations.</p>
		<p>Prodigal</p> 	<p>Spending money or using resources freely and recklessly; wastefully extravagant.</p>
		<p>Freedom</p> 	<p>The right to speak, think and act as you want. To be free from something undesirable. To not be imprisoned or enslaved.</p>
		<p>Parable</p> 	<p>A simple story that tells a message to its audience.</p>
