Parents and Carers,

We hope you all had an 'egg-tastic' Easter break; we are very happy to welcome the children back for new term and to begin our exciting summer units of learning. In the first half term, we will be building on the children's historical knowledge of Saxons and Vikings and completing a looking at historical events of the Vikings through a local viewpoint. Within science, we will be continuing to develop knowledge on animals as we consider animals' digestion and teeth. The children will also be returning to art topic where they will be refining their sketching and painting skills. They will have the opportunity to undertake tasks such as: creating a background using a wash, using a range of brushes to create different effects and creating reflections. Within our PSHE lessons, we will be exploring 'living in the wider world', where children will be encouraged to consider topics including brushing teeth, hygiene and puberty. The children will also explore the concept of 'temptation' throughout our RE unit.

After half term, we will be undertaking our final geography unit of the year which will involve studying changes in climate and land use. In DT, the children will have the opportunity to develop their understanding of structures and construction as they create their own toy. The children will also be discussing how to act responsibly when using computers and creating spreadsheets in computing. Year 4 PE days will remain on a Monday and Tuesday. Please remember, on our PE days, children need to come to school wearing PE kit that consists of: a plain colour t-shirt and dark coloured bottoms. If you child has long hair, please ensure it is tied back. During the term, PE will look at developing their skills in games such as athletics and field games.

With regards to what you can do at home to support your child's learning, we would suggest completing regular reading (this should be logged on Boom Reader) to improve fluency when reading. We have also attached some stem questions at the bottom of the letter which can be used to support conversations/questioning when reading together. This term the children will be completing an official multiplication test. We continue to dedicate sessions to practising multiplication and using Times Table Rockstar but continuing this practise at home is incredibly important to best support the children in mastering their times table knowledge. If you wanted to support your child with spelling, we would suggest beginning with the words on the year 3/4 government spelling rules. These are also attached. Similar to Times Table Rockstar, we would encourage regular, short burst practise of a small group of these words at one time.

Below is the topic homework for this term. We do not mind how this work is presented- it can be a presentation, a letter, a recorded video, sculpture, model or a piece of artwork. Thank you for the homework that has been created so far this year. We have loved looking at it on display and look forward to creating our new display for the children to showcase their spectacular work.
