




A heart-warming adventure about the unbreakable bond between a dog and his human from a beloved and twice Costa-shortlisted author.




Flo, Joseph and their friends Funmi and Isaac find a map and follow clues taking them to a secret island to save Mum and expose Titan's fishy plans...





race to uncover the City of Secrets!


'The boy's an absolute menace.' 'He's a bully. A lost cause!' 'Why can't he be more like his sister?'



Aya is eleven years old and has just arrived in Britain with her mum and baby brother, seeking asylum from war in Syria.







Then his best friend Leah suggests that rather than wait for a family to come to him, he should go out and find one. So begins **The Perfect Parent Project** ... But Sam may just discover that family has a funny way of finding you.





Twelve-year-old Matthew is trapped in his bedroom by crippling OCD, spending most of his time staring out of his window as the inhabitants of Chestnut Close go about their business. Until the day he is the last person to see his next door neighbour's toddler, Teddy, before he goes missing. Matthew must turn detective and unravel the mystery of Teddy's disappearance with the help of a brilliant cast of supporting characters. Page-turning, heartbreaking, but ultimately life-affirming, this story is perfect for fans of The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night Time and Wonder. It is a book that will make you laugh and cry.
