

Reading Newsletter: Autumn One



Supporting your child at home to develop their reading comprehension.

Top Tips:

1) Ask questions and have conversations

The more children talk, the more ready they are to read and write. You can talk about what you are reading and ask questions as you go. Curiosity promotes understanding.

2) Develop vocabulary by talking about words and word meanings.

Unlocking word meaning is one of the most important reading comprehension skills that allow us to derive meaning from text as a whole.

3) Activate background knowledge.

Make connections between ideas in the text and their own prior knowledge and personal experiences helps children with comprehension.

4) Monitoring comprehension.

Check that your child has understood the text and if not model rereading to check or clarify. Comprehension involves assessing and evaluating your own understanding.

5) Embrace storytelling in all its forms.

All text should be celebrated. Encourage your child to read what they love but also to try new things. Any engagement with text is a positive reading experience.

Why is reading at home so important?

Children with access to 25 books at home complete an average of 2 more years of school than children from homes without any books.







Reading is a critical

skill for succeeding in

most school subjects.

A child spends 900 hours a year in school and 7800 hours at home.

Kids 4-5 years old gain 6 months of reading ability by being read to 3 to 5 times per week.



Research shows that just 20 minutes a day spent reading with a child helps them develop critical reading skills.








Adam Kay is a BAFTA-winning author, TV writer, comedian and former junior doctor.
